We Value Your Future

Mill Park Secondary College operates on a set of four agreed values: **Respect, Responsibility, Achievement and Enjoyment**. These values form the basis for all interactions between staff, students, parents, and the broader community. Our aim is to ensure our students enter the world as well-educated and motivated individuals who have pride in their achievements.

Learning at Mill Park Secondary College

The dual campus structure of our college ensures that our learning environment is tailored to the needs of our students, and their 'age and stage' of learning, growth and development. This means that our curriculum, learning environment, and approach is integrated and informed by evidence about differing needs of Middle Years and Senior students.

Our comprehensive Middle Years program is designed to progressively develop core skills and concepts across all learning areas. It also ensures that students become increasingly independent and self-aware as learners, so that by the time that they reach the end of Year 9 and graduate from the Middle Years Campus they are capable across a broad range of subjects, calm and confident in their approach, can identify their passions and begin planning a pathway through their final years of schooling and beyond.

Our timetable structure is designed specifically to support these aims and at the Middle Years Campus lessons range in length, allowing us to deliver:

- Targeted 30-minute sessions to reinforce key concepts and skills, particularly in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy, and regular check-ins on student engagement and wellbeing through Engage.
- Core 60-minute sessions to support the introduction of new knowledge and skills, underpinned by our College Instructional Model.
- Extended 90-minute sessions allowing students explore concepts in depth, apply their new learning, developing confidence and mastery in their skills and understanding.

Teachers at the Middle Years Campus are specialists at these year levels and are committed to supporting young people to thrive through this important stage of learning and development. The dual campus structure means that the number of students on each site is large enough to ensure that students are provided with choice and positive connections, and small enough to ensure that the learning environment is manageable, and that every student is known and supported as an individual.

Student Engagement and Wellbeing

Student engagement is an integral part of supporting the wellbeing, development and learning of students at Mill Park Secondary College. In addition to a range of targeted programs and wellbeing focused events, time is created in our timetable to support students with social, emotional, and personal growth. In Views 7 to 9, a Programs, Learning and Events coordinator arranges incursions, excursions, events, and camps to enrich student experiences, while Engagement Mentors assist students to navigate issues, and become confident, independent learners.

In Years 7 to 9, students participate in Engage lessons twice a week that focus on establishing strong routines, building positive relationships, setting personal goals, and developing resilience. Year 7 students are given additional transition support through the Explore program which allows them to find their place within Mill Park Secondary College and explore their personal interests through Clubs.

In Years 10 to 12, students have a weekly Connect session where they set goals, develop skills for study and life, and receive mentoring from their peers and teacher.

Students are also supported by Student Engagement Leaders at each year level. These coordinators develop strong relationships with students of their cohort and promote student welfare through supporting positive peer relationships and promoting students to demonstrate the College values of Respect, Responsibility, Achievement and Enjoyment.



Middle Years Program

Year 7

Our Year 7 program is focused on supporting a smooth transition to the College and building the foundations of a successful secondary education. Students are introduced to a variety of subjects, with specialist teachers and facilities studying English, Mathematics, Humanities, Science, Health and Physical Education, Hindi or Italian, Information Technology, Visual Art, Materials Technology and Dance and Drama.

They also receive weekly Literacy and Numeracy lessons to strengthen and support core learning and life skills. Students are supported to build relationships and set personal goals and reflect on their progress in Engage lessons, while exploring their personal interests through their nominated Club once a fortnight.

Year 8

In Year 8 students extend their learning in English, Mathematics, Humanities, Science, Health and Physical Education, and Hindi / Italian. Literacy and Numeracy lessons continue to support students to strengthen these core skills and enhance their learning across other subjects. Students also participate in semesterlong studies of Music, Food Technology, Visual Art, and Fabrics Technology, where they develop a wide range of skills before selecting electives in Year 9.

Year 9

Students in Year 9 expand their horizons by participating in a broad range of electives and special programs. As well as their core subjects students can choose six electives from a selection of more than 30 across the full range of learning areas. Students have the opportunity specialise in areas of interest and try subjects they might be considering for their Senior Years.


Year 9 prepares students for their transition to Senior Campus, making appropriate and informed subject selections and establishing pathways that support their future goals. All Year 9 students undergo Morrisby career testing and counselling, and participate in our City School Program, where they spend time in the CBD pursuing an inquiry project.

Academic Excellence

SEAL Program

Mill Park Secondary College is an accredited provider of Select Entry Accelerated Learning (SEAL) programs for gifted and high ability students. Students are selected for this program through a combination of academic testing and demonstrated strong learning behaviours, and participate in an accelerated program from Years 7 to 10 that recognises their high potential as learners. SEAL students progress through year level subject content at an accelerated pace, allowing for additional time to be spent on mastery of skills, deepening of thinking through inquiry projects, and enrichment activities that expose students to real-world problems.

Working in a setting with like-minded peers and skilled teachers, SEAL students are expected to demonstrate commitment to their learning beyond the classroom. Students are encouraged to participate in student leadership activities as well as extra-curricular programs that suit their interests (including sport, public speaking, and community engagement).

SEAL students are expected to undertake a minimum of one early start VCE subject in Year 10, with many students undertaking two. This provides students the opportunity to develop core study skills and habits and participate in a wider variety of VCE subjects by the time they complete Year 12.

Accelerated English Program

Mill Park Secondary College offers an Accelerated English Program to a selected group of students commencing at Year 7. The Accelerated English program will mirror the SEAL English subject in terms of its text selection and degree of rigour. Students will study advanced texts and be exposed to a higher range of literary skills and techniques. In Year 10, Accelerated English students will participate in a hybrid course that prepares students for success in all three VCE English streams – English, English Language, and English Literature – with students encouraged to complete two VCE English subjects.

Accelerated Science Program

Mill Park Secondary College offers an Accelerated Mill Park Secondary College offers scholarships to Science Program to a selected group of students Year 7 students who have displayed outstanding commencing at Year 7. The Accelerated Science commitment to their education and involvement in the Program supports students to develop an College community. Accelerated Science students progress through the year level curriculum at a faster pace, for two years, and are available for Years 7 - 8. allowing for deepening of scientific thinking through inquiry projects, scientific investigations and realworld application tasks. In Year 10, students will study an Accelerated Science subject incorporating Laboratory Skills and VCE Science preparation and are encouraged to accelerate into an early start VCE or VET science subject.

Scholarship Program

Diversity of Choice

As well as the formal curriculum, Mill Park Secondary College has an extensive range of programs that allow students to participate in learning and engagement opportunities and activities beyond the classroom.

The school has three areas of focus in its co-curricular program:

Music & Performing Arts

The College offers a flagship program in the performing arts. Many students choose to undertake instrumental music lessons available in percussion, guitar, keyboards, and voice. Performance groups such as choirs, bands and dance ensembles offer exciting opportunities for developing skills, confidence, and performance opportunities for students.

Held annually in our 400 seat Performing Arts Centre, the College Production, and Song and Dance Night are highlights for our school community. These events support a long tradition of showcasing the talents of our students, and the dedication and expertise of our specialised staff.



Sport

Sport and physical recreation are important elements of leading a balanced and well-rounded school life. At the Middle Years Campus students can engage in afterschool basketball and soccer squads, building skills, fitness, and social connections. At the Senior Campus there are regular lunchtime tournaments across several sports which are also a popular fixture on the school calendar.

Students can join and participate in a variety of interschool sports teams including volleyball, tennis, cricket, soccer, badminton, hockey, basketball, table tennis, football, netball, softball, and baseball. Major intra-school carnivals are also held during the year, with successful students progressing to represent the school in the Northern Zone Finals and State Finals.

The College has access to outstanding on-site sporting facilities, including gymnasiums, and a full-sized football/cricket oval. Nearby facilities include the Meadowglen Athletics Track, Mill Park YMCA, and Mill Park Basketball Stadium.

Leadership and Community Engagement

Mill Park Secondary College is proud of its student leaders who are an active voice in their school and local communities. As well as formal development programs for student leaders, the school provides a range of opportunities to connect with representatives from Local and State Governments, and to network with other young leaders from local secondary schools.

Our students are active participants in Interschool Debating and Public Speaking competitions and many students compete regularly across the school year.





Year 10

Year 10 students design their learning course to suit their specific passions, career goals and pathways. As well as their core studies, they also choose five electives from over 40 options within the learning areas of English, Science, Mathematics, Humanities, Arts, Language, Technology and Health and Physical Education. Students at Mill Park Secondary College can choose from one of the broadest and most comprehensive ranges of VCE, VET and VM units in the northern suburbs. More than 50 units are offered. Students can complete a full VCE program, a VCE program mixed with VET training units, or a VCE Vocational Major program. The timetable at the Senior Campus is designed to

Years 10, 11 & 12 - Senior Years

At Mill Park Secondary College the specialised Senior Campus provides a more independent learning environment where students can pursue individualised choices in their learning, supporting them to navigate their pathway to the world beyond secondary school. While the campus has a strong academic emphasis, it also has excellent support for students – this includes mentoring and study support, careers advice and support, and specialist VCE teachers who are passionate about their subject areas and who go above and beyond to support their students to achieve success. The structure and size of the campus ensures that students have access to a wide variety of subjects to suit their interests and future pathways. Most students undertake the VCE in their final years and enter University at a tertiary level, however, many students undertake the VCE Vocational Major and are supported to commence work related training, and a certificatebased VET study as part of their course. These vocational studies occur on-campus, but also off-site at the school's specialised trade training centre (Outer Northern Trade Training Centre) or at other local secondary schools. With a diverse range of students, we are proud to be able to offer senior programs which respond to their varied needs and support their aspirations for success.



Years 11 & 12

The Senior Campus has a strong academic emphasis and has a comprehensive program of examinations at each year level, including trial exams and revision programs for Year 12 students in their final year. Students also have access to multiple supervised study spaces including the Library and Senior Study Centre, and are supported to use these spaces independently to help achieve their goals.
